
Prophet

Filip

Frankfurt, 1943. Filip is a typical cosmo-politan, a lady-killer incapable of any deeper affection. He lost his family in Poland. Now, living in the heart of Nazi Germany, he has to hide his Jewish origins and oftentimes escapes death by a hair's breadth. He works as a waiter in an exclusive hotel restaurant and enjoys a carefree life, surrounded with luxuries, beautiful women, and friends from all over Europe. But when the war starts taking its deadly toll on his loved ones, the fragile world he built for himself collapses like a house of cards. Soon, the Allied bombers will blow this vibrant tower of Babel off the face of the Earth.

The script is inspired by the biography of the cult Polish author Leopold Tyrmand, who was a Polish novelist, writer, and editor. He emigrated from Poland to the United States in 1966, where he wrote for "The New Yorker" and lectured at the State University of New York and Columbia University.

Oedipus Rex

Król Edyp

A curse hangs over Oedipus from which he cannot free himself, and its stigma also weighs on his offspring. The tragedy portrays a man who has spent his entire life fleeing his destiny, until he finally accepts his fate and its consequences by taking full responsibility for his crime and exacting his own punishment and penance. A recurring motif of the play is the epidemic that sweeps the entire city and destroys the happiness of Oedipus and his family. The problems of man's greatness and downfall, his freedom and limitations, taken up in "Oedipus the King," are extremely relevant today. Jacek Raginis-Królikiewicz's film is set in a world that combines features of antiquity, the present and the future. The thoroughly modern interiors are combined with ancient styling. Some of the dialogue parts are sung or expressed in the form of melorecitation. A recurring motif of the play is an epidemic that engulfs the entire city, eventually destroying the happiness of Oedipus and his family.

Hania studies at the State Higher School of Theatre in Warsaw. One day, she attends a theatrical premiere of Dziady (Forefathers' Eve) by Adam Mickiewicz, a literary work that is an expression of the deepest patriotic feelings, an image of the nation's suffering in captivity and an image of the struggle against an invader. The then government believed that "Dziady" was an allusion to its ruling and it may instigate uprisings. At the premiere, Hania meets Janek, a student at the university of technology. Their meeting is the beginning of great love. The carefree and all lovey-dovey couple is completely uninterested in politics which, however, starts to influence their lives in a more and more brutal way. The persecution of citizens of Jewish origin is gaining on strength. Hania's father, an excellent doctor, and her mother lose their jobs and are among those affected by the anti-Semitic purge. With no money and no prospects for the future, Hania's family decides to emigrate. But the girl does not want to leave. The circle of history speeds up: Students in Warsaw protest in defence of Dziady, which has been removed from the stage due to political reasons. The protests culminate in a rally at the university and its brutal pacification. Hania and Janek take part in it, paying a very price. They are beaten up, arrested, interrogated, and expelled from their universities. It is a harsh lesson of civic maturity for both of them.

The Pauper and the Madame

The film The Pauper and the Madame depicts the unique fate of Adam Chmielowski, an artist-painter who, in search of freedom and happiness, sacrifices everything. His rebellious nature and conflict with evil make him not only escape from the tsarist captivity hidden in a coffin, but in the moments of greatest fame, he abandons the world of art to "die for the world" and devotes himself to serving people. His tragic fate is completed by a spiritual breakdown, expulsion from the Jesuit order, and confinement in a mental institution. Soon, however, he rises like a phoenix from the ashes and then, mad with love for others, he returns in great style as Brother Albert - the future saint. The epic story is completed by his friends – Helena Modrzejewska and Józef Chełmoński, the most famous artists of their epoch, but each in their own tragic way, will come to realize that the most beautiful art is the art of a beautiful life.

Marusarz – Tatra Eagle

Marusarz – Tatrzański Orzeł

It is a TV feature film, which tells the story of Stanisław Marusarz, a legendary ski jumper and precursor of Polish ski jumping. The film presents the story of his life, as well as the life of his sister Helena, a talented skier and member of the Resistance Movement, murdered by the Nazis in 1941. Stanisław Marusarz is not only a well-known Polish ski jumper but also the 1938 world vice-champion in Lahti, a fourtime Olympian, a seven-time participant in the ski world championships, as well as a second lieutenant of the Home Army, a Tatra courier. From the first months of occupation, he actively worked as a courier of the Underground State and would deliver correspondence to Hungary. In 1940, he jumped from the second floor and escaped from the Gestapo prison in Cracow. After the war, he was one of the longest active ski jumping athletes in the world. Marusarz was a guest of honour at the Four Hills Tournament in the season 1965-1966. At the age of 53, he stood on the famous Gross-Titlis-Schanze (Large Titlis hill) and made his legendary show jump dressed in a suit and a tie.

The story of Romek Cudakowski, a musician who, risking his life, freed from a ghetto his biggest competitor, an exceptional violinist Szymon Akerman. The men had conflicted before the war broke out because Romek thought that Akerman would take away from him the most lucrative odd jobs. After escaping from the ghetto, Szymon plays in the Romek's orchestra in a brothel, which usual guests are Germans. The better the men get to know each other, the more the differences that once divided them fade away.

The film belongs to a series of feature films titled Whoever Saves One Life, Saves the World Entire, presenting stories of Poles rescuing their Jewish neighbours, friends and complete strangers during WWII.


Magdalene

Magdalena



The Republic of Children

In the winter of 1903 a bunch of figures created by the master painter Jacek Malczewski escape the canvas. Fauns, chimeras, vodniks, undines, and other fantastic creatures brought to life by a paintbrush of the famed artist are transported to wetlands in contemporary Poland, to a place known as Mszarv. A large hydroelectric power plant is about to start operating nearby. The water will flood thousands of hectares of land. A second group of runaways sets out from an orphanage in a village designated for inundation. This one consists of children opposing the decisions of adults that are meant to separate them forever. Tobiasz, a boy who was among the figures transported to the future straight from Malczewski's paintings, decides to join them and becomes their leader. The boy is being followed by Rafał, his guardian angel. The natives of Mszary must manage the unexpected visit of outsiders on their territory. Will the residents of wetlands help the young dissidents create the Republic of Children they've been dreaming of?


Powołanie

It is a TV theatre play about Karol Wojtyła's path to priesthood. The story starts with Karol's arrival to Cracowtostudy Polish philology at the Jagiellonian University. The action concludes when Wojtyła is ordained a priest by Cardinal Adam Sapieha. The plot covers the period of WWII – the time when the future pope matures spiritually. During that time Karol reads extraordinary books and takes part in secret schooling. He meets Jan Tyranowski, who becomes his mentor, introduces him to discussions of mysticism and encourages him to work on his spirituality. After that Wojtyła makes his life decision, he leaves the theatre group of Mieczysław Kotlarczyk and enters the seminary.

It is a shocking picture of the last few months in a military prison for Polish officers before the Katyn massacre. Wasilij Zarubin, a Soviet secret service officer, after a failed mission in Germany is about to be executed but, in the face of a sudden outbreak of WWII, Stalin gives him a new task: his new mission is to enlist Polish officers from Kozielsk, Starobielsk, and Ostaszków camps to the Soviet Army. Zarubin's methods are cynical. By abusing his position in a treacherous way, he tries to antagonize officers, extract crucial information and encourage them to cooperate with Soviet communists. A success of Zarubin's mission depends on the attitudes of Polish officers' towards his manipulations. This TV movie depicts the horrific situation of Polish officers living under pressure in captivity. The screenplay is based on true, evidenced story.

The Butler

The film tells the story of a tragic yet reciprocal love of a young German aristocrat to a Polish butler. The social and moral differences are the reason why the feeling, which brought them together, has no chance of existence. A complicated history of people of three nations living in the northern region of Poland - Poles, Kashubian, and German, forms the background of the main story. Their lives are shown in a broad perspective over the period of 25 years, from 1920 until 1945. At the same time, the Second Republic of Poland is formed and many German estates are situated on the Polish side of the border. This situation not only generates numerous conflicts, but it also gives excellent ground for the birth of Nazism. The dramatic events of the war and an equally strong trauma caused by the entry of Soviet troops permanently cause a personal tragedy of the main characters - Marita von Krauss and Mateusz Kroll. Will their love survive in the worst moments in the history of Europe?

It is a story of parents of a cursed soldier*, who died in 1946, told from a perspective of their 17-year-old grandson Janek. Department of Security digs up his body four times to make sure that the enemy of the state is truly dead. The mother cannot bear the humiliation, she steals away the coffin with the body, forces the husband to travel to Pacławska Calvary to bury their son again. The journey is full of dramatic events. Travellers are joined by Jurgen, a German fugitive from a prisoner-of-war camp.

The film, which is written into the dramatic history of the post-war Poland, still remains universal in its story – a struggle of two parents to regain their dignity and balance in life after losing their child.


*cursed soldiers – The end of the struggle of WWII in Europe did not mean peace for all. Thousands of people joined the partisan movements. The scale of their resistance resulted in a regular war being fought on numerous territories of Poland, Lithuania, Latvia, Estonia, and Ukraine up to the mid-50s. Today, we call those people the Forgotten Soldiers, Forest Brothers or insurgents.

The Stars

The film tells the story of Jan Banaś, a famous rightwing midfielder of Polish national team, who had a Polish-German origin and whose goal let Poland take the lead in the match against England in Chorzów in 1973. The film is a remarkable experience for the fans of football, but it is also a well-told story of an uneasy path to glory, its ups and downs.

Jan Banaś grows up in Silesia. From his childhood, his greatest passion is football, and his greatest rival, a devoted friend, Ginter. As time passes by, friends' competition transfers from the backyard to the stadiums of Silesian football clubs: Polonia Bytom and Górnik Zabrze. However, this is not the end of their rivalry. True emotions emerge when beautiful Marlena shows up in the life of both sport stars. When they both court her, Jan and Ginter quickly discover that there are no rules in the game of love. When a serious injury ends Ginter's career and in the same time brings Banaś closer to joining Górski's Eagles team, the main character faces a difficult choice that will determine the rest of his life. From now on, a chance to participate in the Olympic Games and the Football World Cup can be irreversibly lost.

The film shows an obscure episode from the life of a Stalinist criminal Colonel of the Office of Public Security, Julia Brystiger. Her nickname was "Bloody Luna" because during interrogations she tortured prisoners with extreme cruelty. At the beginning of 1960s she appeared in Laski near Warsaw, in the Institute for the Blind, where the Primate of Poland, Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński, was also a frequent visitor. His imprisonment in the years 1953-1956 was supervised by none other than Julia Brystiger herself. During the difficult and tempestuous conversation with the Primate, Julia Brystiger rejects the communist ideology, asks for her crimes to be forgiven and for help in finding God.

Karski

Jan Karski has become an international icon of the fight for dignity and human rights, as well as a voice for the opposition to totalitarianism. He personified universal human values: courage, bravery and the responsibility for the lives and safety of others. Karski, an extremely intelligent and skilled diplomat, was assigned as an emissary of the Polish Underground State during WWII. In that role, throughout 1942 and 1943, he reported to the British and to the Americans, providing the allies with one of the earliest and most accurate accounts of the Holocaust. Karski is a multi-narrative TV drama which shows not only the story of Jan Karski himself but also his influence on future generations. Through intertwining plots, one depicting a contemporary group of young people aiming to create a film about Karski, and the other, a historical portrayal of Karski's life during WWII, the film shows us the significance of Karski's dilemmas and moral choices, which to this day influence young peoples' attitude towards the reality that surrounds them. The gripping plot is further enhanced by incorporating both archival footage and current media coverage into the film.

Umbra

An allegorical picture about discovering oneself on a conscious and subconscious level, about reaching out into the deepest, hidden secrets. Through symbols, music, and dance it tells a story of a girl gone missing and later a woman seduced by the evil touch who cannot break free from it and fights her emotions towards her tormentor. The protagonist, Alice, experiences sexual abuse as a child, which is ignored and negated by those in her surroundings. Silence causes the abuse to be pushed out of her consciousness. The consequences, however, are apparent in her life, which appears to her as a dream in which the boundaries between the real and surreal are elusive. Alice struggles alone with her illusions about the world and herself. To discover the truth, she embarks on a journey inside herself.

Chernobyl. Four Days in April

Czarnobyl. Cztery dni w kwietniu

The memorable catastrophe in the Chernobyl power plant took place on 26th April 1986 at 1:27 am, affecting lives of over 300,000 people inhabiting the surrounding areas of the former USSR territory in a direct and immediate manner. The long-term consequences of the released radiation, the biggest in the history, are felt to this day and are expected to be still harmful for human health in the next decades. The docu-drama reconstructs four days following the disaster from the point of view of Polish communist political and military circles, alarmed by the medical centre for science in Warsaw, as well as reactions of foreign journalists based in Moscow. Poland, the first country on the way of the radioactive cloud, was anxious about possible harm it might bring to people.

Agnieszka Osiecka was a poet, a director, a journalist, and a leading figure in the pantheon of great Poles. She authored over 2000 songs, skits and stage works. 'The poetess of broken colour', as she was named by Jan Kott, wrote lyrics for songs which remain all time top hits in Polish popular music. Her songs were performed by the most celebrated Polish singers, such as Maryla Rodowicz, Edyta Geppert, Sława Przybylska, Anna Szałapak, Seweryn Krajewski or Skaldowie. On the one hand Agnieszka was a brilliant poet, the life and soul of the party, but on the other she was also a restless spirit, a sensitive and delicate human. The viewers can follow dozens of years of her fascinating life – from her early youth, through years of studying at the Łódź Film School and working in famous student theaters, until times of her spectacular success and great fame. The action is set against the backdrop of the Polish colorful social life between mid-1950s until mid-90s and it is focused not only on her professional career, but also it centers on some facts from her private life, which was very complicated, full of hard choices and suffering. 
Mothers of Wartime


Love and Empty Words







This time the subject of the broadcast is the end of the world predicted by the Mayan calendar. The speaker asks the listeners what it actually means to each one of them. They talk about things that are tragic, painful and sometimes trivial and funny. Their need to be heard, to communicate, to share their experience with someone else is evident and moving. The radio is a motif linking this night's events so we hear it in the ambulance, in a city's monitoring centre, where we observe the night life of the city presented on dozens of screens. The radio binds the elements of the film together in terms of structure and meaning. It is the source of the most important questions.


Beloved Old Offenders






Student Book and Rifle. Underground Education

It is a story about the idea of underground education as a form of opposition to Hitler's plans to turn Poles into slaves, through the biological destruction of the intelligentsia and the liquidation of educational institutions. The film presents the moment when underground education was already established at the time of the defense of Warsaw and the formation of the Civic Committee for the Defense of Warsaw, in close connection with the structures of the armed struggle that were being created at the same time. Already in October 1939, the Secret Teaching Society "TON" was established, which later became the coordinator of underground education at all levels throughout Poland. The three main centers of underground education were Warsaw, Cracow, and Poznań. The underground education, especially at the higher level, was closely linked to the armed struggle, which was particularly evident in sudden arrests. As a result of one of such sudden arrests of two female messengers on the street, the entire sociology department in Żoliborz district in Warsaw was detected, arrested, and then executed.

May the 3rd, That Is Today



Every zoo aims to protect animal species from extinction. During WWII, the Warsaw Zoo carried out its function in a rebellious manner. Once the war began, the Nazis killed some animals and transferred the others to the Third Reich. The abandoned enclosures were taken over by the species most endangered by warfare: the man. The Jews escaping the inevitable death and the Home Army soldiers found shelter in the empty stables, kennels, and aviaries as well as in the house of Jan Żabiński, the then Director. The Zoo offered a hiding place - sometimes for a day, rarely for a few months - to several hundred people. The exact number remains unknown. The film tries to tell this incredible story by means of metaphorical shots of animals, abundant archive footage, and interviews with the last living witnesses.





Girls from Auschwitz



The Seven Summit Run lasts uninterruptedly for 52 hours, during which the participants cover 240 kilometres through the mountains. For two days the runners are deprived of sleep or rest, they do not even stop to eat. After a few hours, runners' toenails start peeling and their nipples start bleeding. People are dehydrated and faint. After 24 hours they start hallucinating. The film depicts not only extreme emotions of the runners, their struggle with extreme exhaustion and loneliness, overcoming new crises both physical and mental, but also euphoria after the run. The film also shows protagonists' daily life, their work and family life. It depicts their personal stories concerning the drive behind their unimaginable effort, their shortcomings for which they try to compensate with running and what they discover thanks to ultramarathons. The intense pace of the film will match the physical exhaustion of its protagonists, at the same time describing their extreme emotions.

On October 24, 1989, Jerzy Kukuczka died fell while climbing Lhotse. It was the first time he went to the Himalayas with money, proper equipment, and international fame. 



One of its participants was Jan Lenczowski, the grandson of Jakub Bujak, who dreamed of repeating his grandfather's success from 1939.































Without Fear
















The Exorcism of Anneliese Michel

Egzorcyzmy Anneliese Michel

The case of a young German girl, Anneliese Michel, who died in 1976 after series of exorcisms, has been an inspiration for the movie The Exorcism of Emily Rose by Scott Derrickson. The death of Anneliese Michel led to the most famous lawsuit in the postwar Germany, so-called Exorcism Death Trial. On April 1, 1978, two exorcists and girl's parents were sentenced to a half-year of imprisonment. In the court's opinion longlasting exorcisms and omission of medical assistance were the reasons for Anneliese's death. The court stated that she was not possessed, but mentally ill. Three years earlier, in Autumn 1975, when the decision to perform the exorcism had been made, Anneliese could refrain from eating for over a dozen of days, ran through all the house, undressed and jumped all over the walls. She spoke six different male voices, had unnatural strength, screamed, cursed, beat and bit her next of kin. In the moments of tranquility, she declared her readiness to suffer for the salvation of others. The exorcism lasted nine months. This documentary tries to explain what really happened in the life of Anneliese.

Everyone listened to Molesta and its lyrics became a code of moral values for young people. The talented band members grew up and went their separate ways. How are they doing on the music market and in life now? What is left of their old ideals? This film brings the viewers back to times when everything was simple and friends were like family.



Samuel Goldwyn, co-founder of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer was born in Warsaw as Szmul Gelbfisz. The Warner Bros was founded by the Wonsal brothers from Maków Mazowiecki (north of Warsaw). The Academy Award record holder with 6 wins, the director Billy Wilder was born near Krakow as Samuel Wilder, Richard Boleslawski, director of movies starring Marlena Dietrich, Greta Garbo or Clark Gable, also came from Poland. 

The unique material covers the entire tour, from the departure in Warsaw, their experiences in New York and further cities, night shots, concert at Carnegie Hall. On the way back, just before departure one of the musicians went missing. Eventually, he was found in jail, only let out after paying bail. 
The Career of Nicodemus Dyzma



Eight people suffering from morbid obesity have decided to undergo surgery to remove four-fifths of their stomachs. It is their only chance for a normal and happy life. Before the surgery, they all struggle with loneliness, social exclusion and life on the verge of disability. Even though their life is not a bed of roses, they believe that the surgery will turn it around and help them in reaching their goal. Eating is their emotional coping mechanism to reduce the stress in everyday life. The program shows how eight people struggle with morbid obesity - from the training camp, where under the guidance of a psychologist, physiotherapist and dietician they learn how to prepare for surgery and life after it, to the struggle in their own homes. 


Margo, Teddy, and Friends
