Niepewność. Zakochany Mickiewicz

The story of the youthful love of the greatest Polish poet Adam Mickiewicz and Maryla Wereszczakówna with the background of no longer existing world of the nineteenth-century Poland. The romantic scenery of borderland manors is a background for strong feelings and bloody political conspiracies. 22-year-old Adam, still a poor teacher, is a guest at Maryla's picturesque family estate. The future bard spends his holidays on horseback trips, trains fencing and conspires against tsarism. Maryla is promised to another – she is to marry the powerful Count Puttkamer, a soldier, a freemason, and a participant in independence movements. Young people's genuine, violent feelings are doomed to failure. Still, in the future, their affection will become the basis for countless analyses by historians, and an inspiration for Mickiewicz's future works, which will have a significant place in culture. The titular "Uncertainty" will be immortalized by Mickiewicz in the famous poem of the same name.

In the second half of the 1970s, a group of teenagers led by a charismatic and unruly vocational school student decided to play punk rock. They were inspired by the band Sex Pistols, which they heard on a foreign radio station, and the emerging "punk" movement.

They begin by sending a letter to Radio Free Europe, which was an important source of uncensored information for Poles under communism. The letter from the young punks from Poland is read on a live program, and the station begins broadcasting a weekly program on punk music. This draws the attention of the communist repression apparatus. Despite the threat, the friends form the punk rock band KSU and introduce elements of London's "punk culture" into their small town. Suddenly, some of the previously well-behaved school youth pierce their cheeks with safety pins, start wearing razor blades, chains, and a mohawk hairstyle....

One lives by the Baltic Sea, the other in the Tatra Mountains. One runs a sweet shop, the other is a successful interior designer. One is a widow, and the other's partner has just left her for someone younger. One devotes herself to children and grandchildren, completely forgetting about herself, the other has no family and only cares about her own spiritual development. One day, the two meet by chance at the funeral of a mutual school friend. Agata inspires Majka to try something new: swap lives. Majka will head to the mountains, whilst Agata will go to the seaside. The unexpected switch of roles brings a series of complications, hilarious twists and challenges that the women will have to face. Will they be able to overcome their old habits, prejudices and fears? Will they have the courage to open up to love and start a new chapter in their lives? Is it really never too late for anything?

Shattered Games

W szachu. Ostatnia rozgrywka

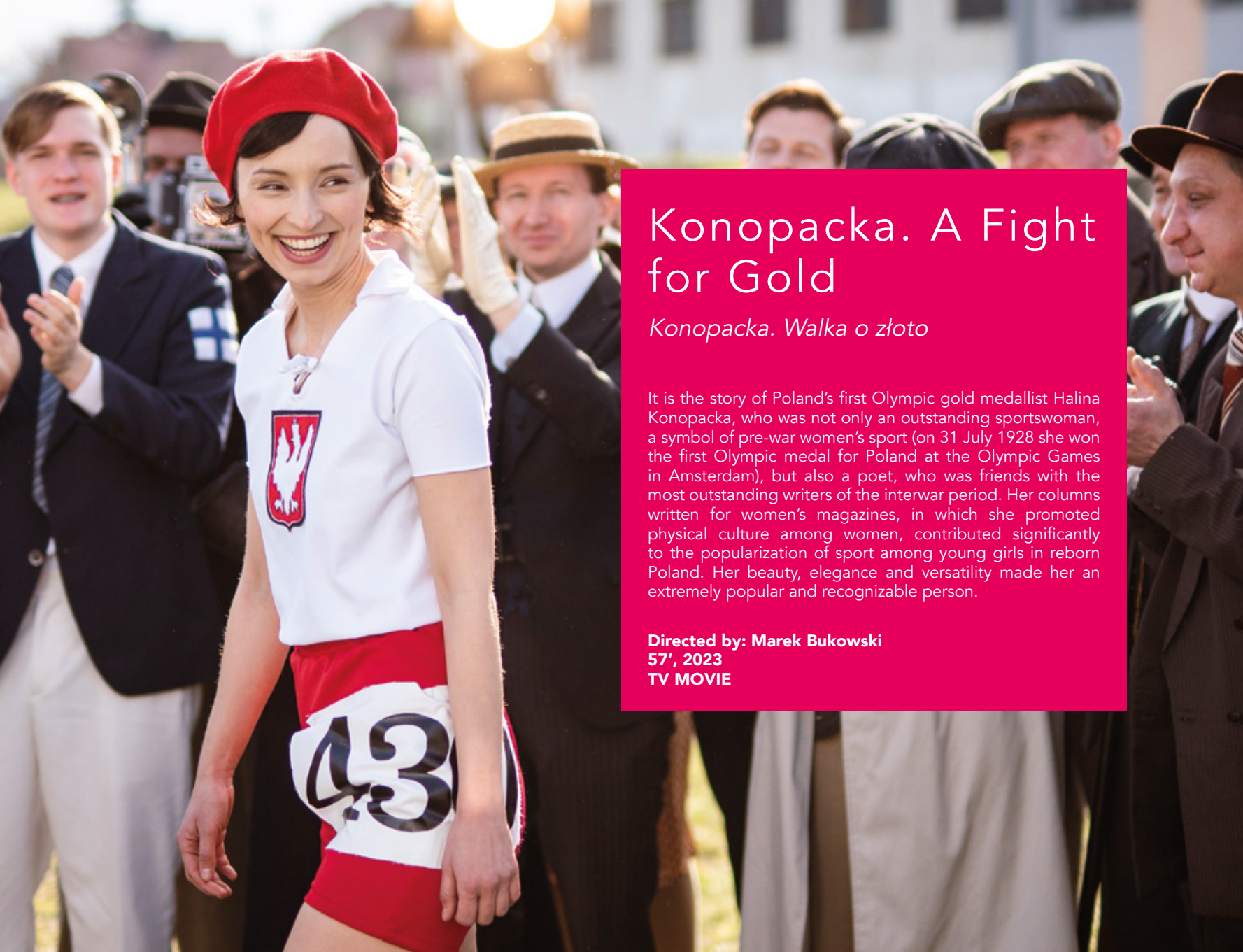
A cinematic tale of Polish chess players, members of the pre-war Polish national team, which stood at the forefront of the world for over a decade. The matches played by them remain an example of masterful moves and games to this day. The heroes of the film, set in the reality of the 1930s, are extraordinary personalities – Akiba Rubinstein, Dawid Przepiórka, Ksawery Tartakower, and the later continuers of their successes, Mieczysław Najdorf, along with Paulin Frydman and Kazimierz Makarczyk.

Like characters from the American cinema of the 1930s or later Cinema Noir, they form a tight-knit group of friends, led by the charismatic David Przepiórka, while the brilliant Akiba Rubinstein shines as its most splendid world-famous star. The chess players' struggles for the greatest trophies and the accompanying difficulties with the health problems of grandmaster Akiba Rubinstein are the main themes of the film. The outbreak of war marks the end of an elegant world and leads to the final disintegration of a golden, brilliant team, known in the Polish chess world as the Bombenmannschaft.

Konopacka. A Fight for Gold

It is the story of Poland's first Olympic gold medallist Halina Konopacka, who was not only an outstanding sportswoman, a symbol of pre-war women's sport (on 31 July 1928 she won the first Olympic medal for Poland at the Olympic Games in Amsterdam), but also a poet, who was friends with the most outstanding writers of the interwar period. Her columns written for women's magazines, in which she promoted physical culture among women, contributed significantly to the popularization of sport among young girls in reborn Poland. Her beauty, elegance and versatility made her an extremely popular and recognizable person.

Two Eagles House. Zofia's Lies

Dom pod Dwoma Orłami. Kłamstwa Zofii

The film tells the story of a complicated love, based on the poignant, emotional, and tragic memories of Zofia Szablewska from the pre-war period of her life in Nowosioło, as well as on the emerging post-war order in The Polish People's Republic. In 1945, after a long ordeal, Zofia finds herself in a former German villa in Wrocław called Two Eagles House. Jan Liski, an officer of the Security Office, who was assigned the house, offers her a room. Zofia constantly revisits memories of her native Borderlands, the estate in Nowosioło and her great love for a Polish settler – Antoni Szablewski. Officer Liski, risking his career and life for Zofia, hopes that the woman will finally understand that he loves her. Can feelings develop between a UB officer and a repatriate from the former Borderlands of the Republic of Poland?

The story of one of the bravest Poles in history and one of WWII most important conspirators. His heroic and sometimes hopeless fight against the two ruthless totalitarianisms of the 20th century, German and Soviet, made communist propaganda want to remove him from the Polish history for nearly 45 years. The film follows the story of a brave conspirator, a loving husband and father, a man who voluntarily agreed to be arrested and transported to Auschwitz. Soon after the end of WWII, Captain Pilecki completed the so-called The Pilecki Report, which is an extraordinary testimony to the German crimes in Auschwitz and the activities of the resistance movement in the camp.

Kraków, Poland 1958. Bronek Budny, after graduating from the officer school of the Ministry of the Interior Affairs, takes a job in the Security Service division in Kraków, in the department dealing with "anti-state" activities of the clergy. His first task is to gather information about Father Wojtyła, who is unknown to the security service, and who has just become the youngest bishop in Poland. Budny is an ideological communist and perfectionist, utterly devoted to his work. For the next 20 years, until Wojtyła's election as Pope, he will remain his shadow. He will spy on him, photograph him, record his sermons, tap his phones, investigate the people he meets, and methodically expand his secret file on Wojtyła. The film is directed in the form of an action drama. It tells a story of the universal struggle between Good and Evil and the clash between Sacrum and Profanum. It is also a psychological study of a self-destructive obsession.


The Hunt

A costume drama about the last rulers of medieval Poland: Władysław Warneńczyk and Kazimierz Jagiellończyk of the Jagiellonian dynasty. Each left a mark on history: one as king of Poland and Hungary, ultimately losing the war against the Turks; the other as the builder of a strong and stable Lithuanian state. The series begins in 1440, when 16-year-old Ladislaus, newly crowned king of Poland after his father's death, embarks on a journey to Hungary to claim its throne. The grand historical events serve as a backdrop for the moral dilemmas and stories of passion, love, joy, and sorrow—timeless emotions that take on new dimensions within the context of medieval customs.

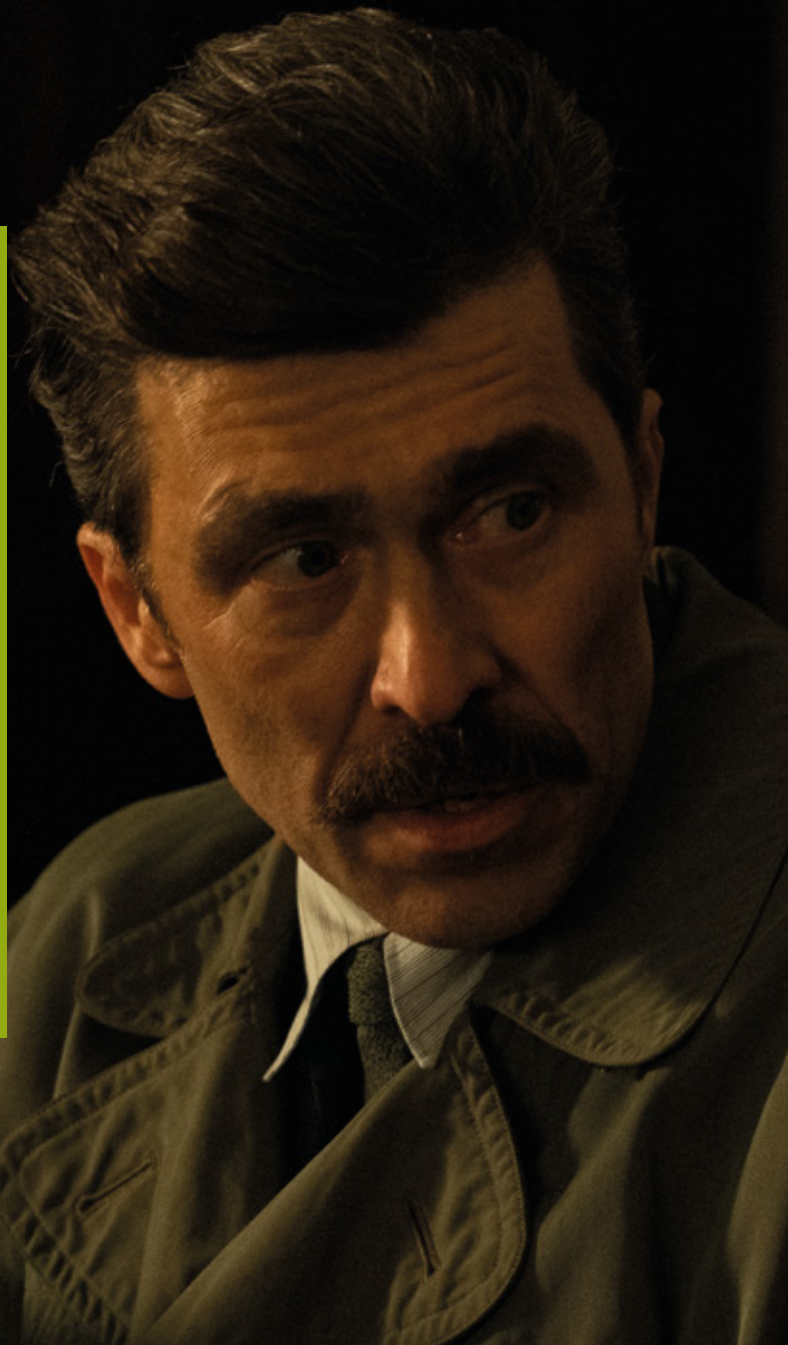

Shadow Play

In the early 1950s, in the People's Republic of Poland, a spy codenamed "Shadow" suddenly disappears. "Shadow" had been providing key information of national interest to British intelligence. Now, both the Polish Security Office and British intelligence are racing to find him. The Minister of Public Security assigns Major Witold Kosek to capture the spy. Much to the dissatisfaction of Colonel Bartman, head of counterintelligence unit, Kosek joins his department. Bartman orders one of his men to find compromising information about Kosek. Meanwhile, in another city, Doctor Helena Bielawska is accused of murdering a high ranking party official who was her patient. Her trial attracts Major Kosek's keen interest. The story blends genres, including crime and spy thriller elements, with psychological drama and action, creating a vibrant cinematic spectacle filled with plot twists.

Imperfect Time

Czas niedokonany

A thrilling family saga about a great love – irrational, impossible, yet all the more beautiful. The series unfolds across multiple time frames and presents the fate of the Polish-Jewish Brok family. The youngest family member, Adam, is a talented financier and manager working for an American investment fund operating in Central Europe. His father, Benedykt, a well-known journalist, did not believe in the possibility of political change and, due to his conformity, loses his relationship with his son. On the other hand, his mother, Zuzanna, a former opposition activist with uncompromising views and ethical principles, tries to guide Adam in taking life decisions.

The series is a tribute to the female heroes of the Solidarity revolution, active in the Workers' Defense Committee, an opposition organization that operated in Poland in 1976-77.

This horrible trauma has never left her since then and still comes back in dreams. While being on holiday to her father, a gruesome crime takes place in the forest nearby, the murder of a family of four. The investigation is led by Commissioner Karol Nadzieja, who happened to work with the profiler in the past. The commissioner decides to invite Julia for cooperation. He is lucky as it turns out the profiler, despite the holiday, agrees to help. When the murder of the family is finally solved, the police find the body of a young woman in the forest. No one even suspects that a sophisticated and cunning serial killer has just begun his "hunt" in a previously quiet area. Will the profiler thanks to her skills solve the mystery of the serial killer?

These situations make the state ruled by Alexander Lukashenko appear as a brutal state, yet permeated with an atmosphere of surrealism. Each episode of the series prompts viewers to reflect on the abstract dimensions of life in Belarus.

Dozen years passed after the Uprising – a guerrilla war that influenced the history of the Polish nation. Less than eighteen-year-old Matylda Bilińska is a restless soul, curious about the world, who is unsatisfied with the teachings instilled in girls at boarding school. Her rebellious nature means that she has to seek help from her immediate family in a charming estate in the countryside. There, she will experience her first love, discover the truth about her loved ones and learn to live on her own terms. Above all, however, she will come face to face with a deadly enemy.

Matylda is a saga of great passion, heroic struggle of good against evil, betrayal, revenge and reparation. In the background, the viewers may follow major historical events of those times.

We Shall Live Together

Będziemy mieszkać razem

When the war in Ukraine broke out, Poland was swept by an extraordinary wave of solidarity. Polish people were eager to help the refugees in any possible way they could. The series tells the story of Basia and Tadeusz, a Polish couple in crisis, who live in a huge, wealthy house of Magda Lipińska, an authoritative and strong-willed mother-in-law. Thanks to Basia and Tadeusz two refugees from Ukraine arrive at the in-laws' house - Anna and little Varya. Unwillingly, but to keep up appearances, Magda lets them stay in her house. This unexpected situation creates numerous comedic but also heartwarming moments. The arrival of refugees initially deepens the marriage crisis of the young couple, but it ultimately saves their relationship. The series talks about people in a warm way. Although it does not explicitly show the brutality of war, it focuses on its consequences in ordinary peoples' lives.

Gdynia, year 1940. Franz Neumann, a young Nazi Abwehr officer discovers his Polish origins. It turns out his real father was a Pole. As a result of an elaborate intrigue, Franz decides to become a spy for the Allies with the code name "Got". His task is to obtain information about the activities of the "Kriegsmarine", primarily with regard to the flagship German battleship involved in the Battle of the Atlantic. Using his charm and charisma, he makes women fall in love with him, manipulates men and gets into the German power elite. Threatened with the possibility that his true identity will be revealed, entangled in relationships with three different women and suspected of treason by Germans and Poles, he must break all the rules and completely change his value system to survive. Does honor matter if everything around him is a lie?

This film is an adaptation of one of Maria Rodziewiczówna's best-known novels of manners. This seven-episode series tells a story about love, honour and family, intertwined with the lives of people from lower and higher social classes whose lives changed after the January Uprising. Marek Cztwan is faced with a new duty imposed on him by his dying father – he has to take additional care of the estate left by his father's lost friend, insurgent magnate Kazimierz Orwid. How will Marek cope with the new situation? Will he succumb to the charms of Irena, the rightful heir to the manor? The ideals of the characters are put to a difficult test, and their desires come into conflict with the duties imposed by their family. Dewajtis, a primeval oak tree, casts its soothing shadow over the heads of those who in its shade are looking for an escape from the hardships of everyday life. The tree becomes a majestic symbol of this intergenerational community.

Stanczyk, Royal Jester

Stańczyk

Court jester to three kings of the Jagiellonian dynasty – Aleksander, Zygmunt Stary, and Zygmunt August – Stańczyk remains an enigmatic figure. Little is known about him; he is believed to have lived between 1480 and 1560, and even his real name is unknown. However, surviving court records reveal that he was paid significantly more than other royal jesters. Stańczyk is remembered for his remarkable qualities: brilliance, intelligence, and foresight. Beneath his ironic sneer he was a true sage who was unafraid to defend the truth and challenge the rulers' mistakes. This is how he is portrayed in the classic portrait by the master of historical painting, Jan Matejko.

The main character of the story is Szymon Kluger, known as "the last Auschwitz Jew." Kluger survived the extermination conducted in the concentration camp, and returned to his hometown in the 1960s. Previously, he had told no one about his dramatic experiences, although he trusted several of his Polish neighbors. Today the last of them share their memories of Szymon Kluger. The film features young students of the local high school, which is an important social venue for the local community; the film reveals previously unpublished archival footage and music composed especially for this film.

The Commandment of Love: The Story of the Ulma Family

*Przykazanie miłości.
Historia rodziny Ulmów z Markowej*

The film chronicles the tragic tale of a Polish family who paid the ultimate price for rescuing Jews during World War II. Józefa and Wiktoria Ulma, along with their seven children, were executed by the Germans for hiding Jews in their home during the Holocaust. In 1995, Wiktoria and Józef Ulma were posthumously honored as Righteous Among the Nations, and in 2010, Polish President Lech Kaczyński awarded them the Commander's Cross of the Order of Polonia Restituta. In September 2023, the Catholic Church beatified the family.

The film shares the story of the Ulma family and their Jewish neighbors through the voices of their descendants and representatives from the village of Markowa, where the tragic events unfolded. Its strengths lie in the use of archival photographs, some taken by Józef Ulma himself, and dramatized scenes that vividly depict the family's daily life.

Researchers from the Polish Genetic Base of Victims of Totalitarianism are heading to Normandy to exhume the remains of 27 Polish soldiers and restore their identities. The research process involves not only scientists and prosecutors but also historians and consular services. As the genetic research unfolds, viewers will also learn about the history of 'Black Devils', a unit that, fighting alongside the Allies, liberated cities in France, the Netherlands, and Belgium, and relentlessly pursued the fleeing Nazis.

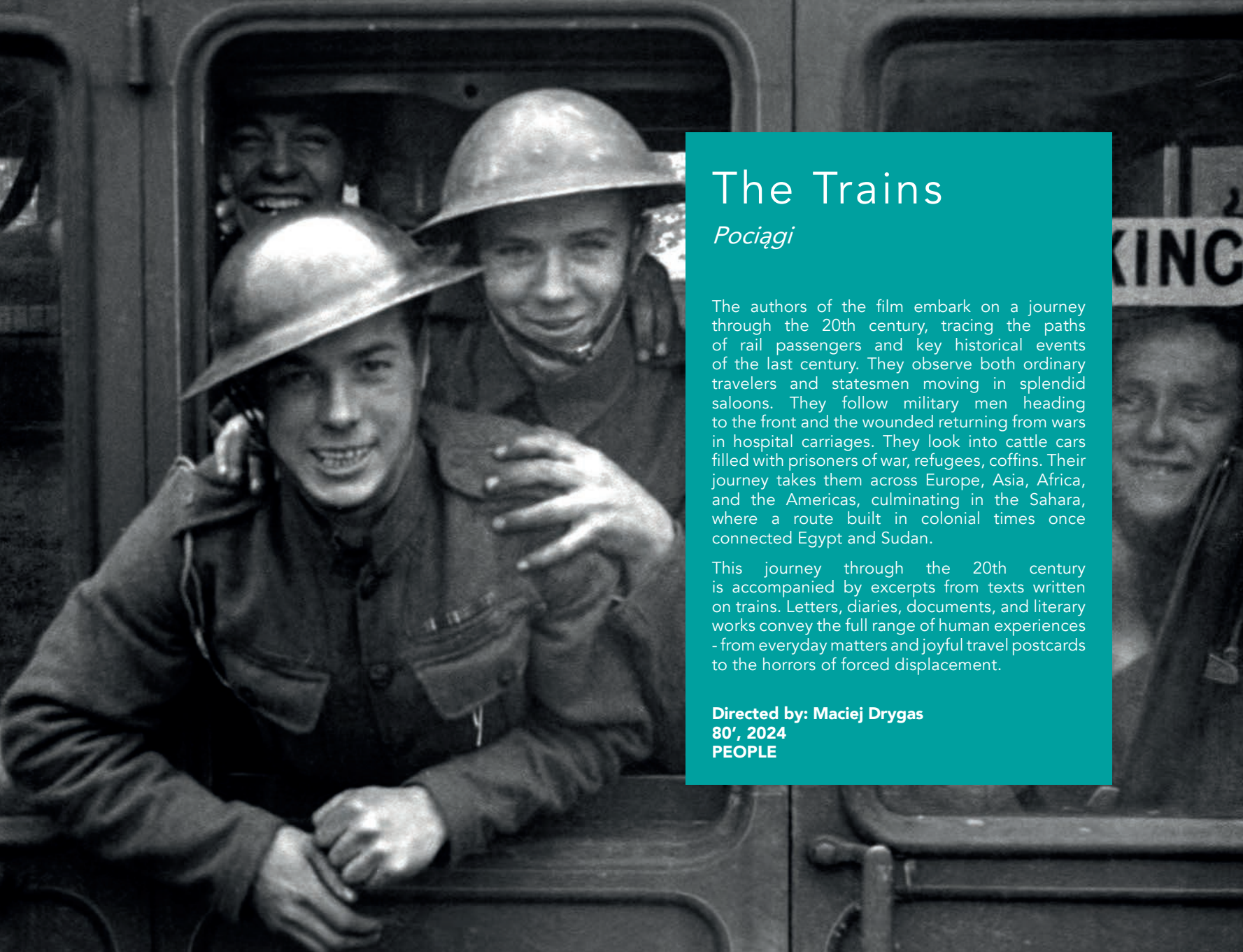

Still Human?

The stories of two people become an opportunity for discussion between doctors from Poland and around the world, supporters and opponents of the procedures used today to adjudicate brain death. In 2003, 11-year-old Agnieszka suffered a brain injury after falling from a horse. Despite pressure and contrary to procedures and applicable law, her parents did not consent to the declaration of brain death and the commencement of the transplantation procedure. Today, Agnieszka is an independent, adult graduate. On the other hand Łukasz, who is in his twenties now, is living with his parents and using a wheelchair, lost consciousness at the age of 19 as a result of a car accident and there was no contact with him for many months. Also in this case, the parents did not believe that their son would remain in vegetative state. Prominent specialists are trying to find out whether the tragic mistakes are the result of medical errors and procedural violations or if the concept of brain death is based on assumptions of a worldview nature that do not have sufficient proof in science.

Marek Biliński – Life is Music

The film recounts the story of the life and creative activity of Marek Biliński, a pioneer of Polish electronic music. The musician celebrated his seventieth birthday in 2023, so it was a perfect moment to present his extensive artistic career. Biliński graduated from the Academy of Music in Poznań, but instead of working at the philharmonic, he chose the uncertain fortunes of a rocker. Fascinated by electronic instruments, he decided to devote himself to searching for new sounds. In the 1980s, he began a solo career, quickly becoming a key figure in the new music scene. During his extensive artistic career, Marek Biliński created multimedia performances, performed at philharmonic houses and open-air venues in front of an audience of many thousands, was a lecturer at the Kuwait Music Academy, and also created the jingle for the most popular TV game show, Koło Fortuny. The film also tells the story of post-war Poland. Using archival materials, the director presents the settlement in the Recovered Territories, the successful propaganda of Edward Gierek's era, the phenomenon of the Jarocin festival or the times of "free" trade in the 1990s.
